Field of the Invention The present invention relates to a semiconductor device provided with a plurality of electrodes each composed of a metal and to a method of producing the same. 2. Description of the Related Art Recently, a lot of attention is paid to the development of a semiconductor device having a plurality of electrodes formed on a substrate surface, such as a power semiconductor device, a solar battery, or a flexible display. FIG. 9 shows an example of a typical structure of a flexible display device for use as a wearable display. A flexible display device 100 includes a pair of electrodes 101 and 102 which face each other on a substrate 105, an insulating layer 103, which is formed on the electrode 101 or 102 and insulates the electrode 101 or 102 from the electrode 102 or 101, and an organic layer 104 which is formed on the electrodes 101 and 102. In this case, when the substrate 105 is bent, a crack may be formed in the organic layer 104 in contact with the substrate 105. In order to avoid formation of the crack, it is conceivable to use a material which does not crack even when the substrate is bent. It is however difficult to select a material, which does not crack even when the substrate is bent, and is also an expensive material. Thus, a material is required to be developed which does not crack even when the substrate is bent and also has a lower material cost. In order to solve the above-described problem, for example, Japanese Patent Laid-

Find more about Sri Lanka in our Almanac! Legal system As shown in the table below, Sri Lanka has a mixed legal system with a civil law system. Public law (such as legislation) is administered by the executive branch of the government. Private law (such as international treaties and executive agreements) is administered by the judiciary. Three distinct laws govern the administration of justice in Sri Lanka: (a)

general law is codified into civil codes and determines the jurisdictional and procedural rights of individuals; (b) customary law is developed and regulated by the legal system; and (c) statutory law, which consists of legislation such as the CCR. A schematic illustration of Sri Lanka's legal system Court system Legal cases are heard by courts of first instance, often smaller in size than the appellate courts. Appeals in Sri Lanka go to the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka. Cases that cannot be settled by negotiations between the parties, at least not in a reasonable amount of time, can be heard in the High Court. The highest court in the country is the Supreme Court of Sri Lanka, which is concerned with hearing cases taken by the appellate courts. There are also specialist courts for hearing cases in commercial, criminal, constitutional, medical and labour law. Courts of first instance District courts District courts are the courts of first instance in civil and criminal cases in Sri Lanka. District courts are established throughout the country to exercise legal jurisdiction in civil and criminal cases within the districts. There are four types of courts in Sri Lanka: (i) district courts (in 40 districts); (ii) circuit courts (in nine provinces); (iii) revenue courts (in 75 revenue divisional secretariat, 42 revenue divisional secretary's offices, 11 regional revenue revenue divisions, 43 commercial revenue divisions, 30 waterworks revenue divisions and 18 municipalities); and (iv) courts of first instance (in the capital city and its suburbs). Court structure District courts In each district, district courts are located in the municipal town. There are 108 district courts in Sri Lanka. District courts deal with civil cases involving a dispute between two or more parties. The functions of district courts are as follows: a) proceedings for the enforcement of judgments against a respondent in civil cases; b) enforcement of judgments against a respondent in civil cases and the recovery of unpaid debts, and the enforcement of liabilities given in
